PROFILE 2012-2013

INTRODUCTION

St. Henry District High School is Northern Kentucky's largest Roman Catholic college-preparatory, co-educational high school. Serving the Diocese of Covington since 1933, our mission is to produce educated, disciplined and well-rounded men and women of strong character and integrity, who are prepared to meet the demanding challenges of the future. St. Henry High School became a district high school in 1984 which serves students in grades nine through twelve. Students come from numerous counties in the Northern Kentucky area as well as adjacent counties in Indiana, and represent our district elementary schools as well as other faith traditions.

THE CURRICULUM

The **academic program** is organized into a seven period day with classes meeting five times per week for forty-six minute periods. The school year runs from the third week of August through the end of May and is divided into four grading periods of nine weeks each. Twenty-four credits are **required for graduation**. These credits must include the following:

Required Community Service (48 hours)

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered in U.S. History, European History, U.S. Government, World History, Psychology, English Language, English Literature, Spanish Language, Latin, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Calculus, Computer Science, Art History, and Studio Art. Of the 280 exams taken, 78% of the students had scores of 3 or higher.

Accelerated Courses are offered in English, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, Anatomy, Algebra I and II, Geometry, Precalculus, Physics, World Civilization, Latin III, and Spanish III.

GRADING AND RANKING

St. Henry assigns number grades using the following system:

A = 93-100% B = 85-92% C = 77-84% D = 70-76% F = 69-below

Advanced Placement courses are weighted at 1.08. Accelerated courses are weighted at 1.04. The weighted average will only be reflected in the student's GPA and not on the transcript as a grade in that particular course.
